Save Patients Time - Order Male Fertility Testing Early

SGF Study Reveals 44% of Couples Not Tested for Infertility at the Same Time

TEST BOTH PARTNERS SIMULTANEOUSLY TO AVOID UNNECESSARY TREATMENTS AND COST TO PATIENTS

Identifying potential obstacles to achieving a pregnancy based on male and female prescreening tests is critical to establishing a diagnosis and personalized treatment plan for infertility, yet according to an SGF national study, 44% of couples revealed that fertility testing was not completed at the same time on both partners. For the male partner, a semen analysis is a non-invasive, low-cost test that assesses a patient's sperm count, motility, and morphology. Because it is such a simple test that yields a substantial amount of pertinent information, Shady Grove Fertility recommends that couples have this test as part of their initial fertility work-up.

Patients may schedule semen analyses at SGF full-service locations throughout Maryland, Pennsylvania, Virginia, Washington D.C., Georgia, and Florida.

LIFESTYLE MODIFICATIONS OR TREATMENT CAN HELP NEARLY **EVERYONE CONCEIVE**

Various lifestyle factors can have an impact on sperm. Sperm are continuously being produced in the body, and take approximately 74 days to fully develop. This means that it takes about 3 months to see improvements from healthy lifestyle changes.

For male infertility, the Center for Male Fertility at Shady Grove Fertility, led by our board certified reproductive urologists Paul R. Shin, M.D. and Cori Tanrikut, M.D., offers a full range of services including basic evaluation and testing to state-of-the-art microsurgical techniques.

Many options exist for men facing infertility. In addition to lifestyle modifications, other non-surgical treatments such as medication and hormone optimization can help resolve fertility challenges. Surgical options also exist to repair blockages, reverse vasectomies, or correct varicoceles. In some situations, assisted reproductive technologies are needed to overcome male factor infertility. In vitro fertilization (IVF) with intracytoplasmic sperm injection (ICSI) allows a single healthy sperm to be injected into the center of each egg. For men with severe male factor issues, surgical sperm retrieval may be a treatment option in conjunction with an IVF-ICSI cycle.
